2. Determine whether the sequence converges or diverges. If it converges, find the limit. Be sure to use limit laws to prove your answer. Ans:

a. $a_n = \frac{3^{n+1}}{4^n}$

b. $a_n = \tan\left(\frac{3n\pi}{1+12n}\right)$ Ans: _____

c. $a_n = \frac{5n!}{2^n}$ Ans: _____

3. Use Calculus to prove that the given sequences are eventually monotone increasing or monotone decreasing or neither. And write the first five terms of the convergent subsequence.

a. $\left\{ \frac{n^2}{n^2 - 1} \right\}_{n=2}^{\infty}$

b. $\left\{ \frac{n!}{5^n} \right\}_{n=1}^{\infty}$

c. $\left\{ \frac{\sqrt{4n^2 + 9}}{n} \right\}_{n=1}^{\infty}$
