Subject: Classified Employees Survey for Fall 2020

The Classified Employees Survey for Fall 2019 survey was sent to part-time and full-time classified professionals on Monday, May 4 and closed on Thursday, May 7th. The purpose of the survey was to collect feedback from classified staff regarding their concerns and input regarding their current work situation and in preparation for fall 2020. 138 classified staff members responded to the survey.

Highlights

- 78% of respondents indicated they were either able to complete all aspects of their jobs remotely or over 75% of their job remotely (question 1).
- Some of the tools and support needed by survey respondents to continue working away from campus include (question 2):
 - 40% - Electronics or ability to bring home electronics from office
 - 24% - Indicated they already have everything they need
 - 16% - The opportunity to access their office or workspace on campus once or periodically to retrieve various tools and resources
 - 10% - Indicated they needed an ergonomic work desk/standing desk and/or chair
 - 6% - Office supplies such as toner, paper, sticky notes, and other
 - 5% - Better internet connection
- Some of the additional tools or support respondents needed for their own safety and well-being while working on campus included (question 3):
 - 53% - Personal protective equipment (PPE)
 - 20% - Plexiglas barriers and dividers
 - 19% - Enforce social distancing rules/clear rules and guidelines
 - 8% - No additional tools or support needed
 - 4% - Rotating schedule (work from home/on campus) to reduce crowding (shifts)
 - 4% - The option to work from home
 - 3% - Limit interactions/contact with students and faculty, reduce service hours or days, promote email/phone interaction

Survey Results

1) How much of your job have you been able to carry out while working away from campus?
