Course Description HUMA 10 Human Sexuality. The comprehensive study of the biological, psychological, and social-cultural aspects of human sexuality. Exploring values and attitudes and their relationship to behaviors and behavioral changes. This will include an assessment of different cultural mores and current safe sex practices. Prerequisites: Advisory EWRT 1A, EWRT 1AH, or ESL 5.

Course Objectives

- 1. Examine the field of human development as behavioral science and its interdisciplinary components, the inter-relationships between the cognitive and affective domains, and their impact on behavior.
- 2. Identify the major components of the male and female sexual anatomy and explain the physiological processes that mediate sexual activity using the language of the human development discipline, including the concept of gender.
- Compare and contrast the various contraception methods currently available
 for men and women; the history of contraception includes natural and surgical
 techniques and historical and cross-cultural views on abortion as a form of
 contraception.
- 4. Describe psycho-physical and psycho-social changes at each stage of sexual development (birth, early childhood, pre-teen, adolescence), including hygiene and sex education.
- 5. Identify the main categories of sexual behavior and recognize their
- 6. biological, psychological, and cultural determinants.

- 7. Illustrate global perspectives on cultural diversity within the discipline using a variety of multicultural/multi-ethnic examples.
- 8. Recognize the incidence, symptoms, causes, treatment, and prevention of major sexual infections, as well as attitudes, myths, and stereotypes.
- 9. Critically analyze, interpret, and examine the assumption or premises of arguments by using behavioral science methodology. Draw reasoned conclusions from the evidence and current media reports regarding the media's impact and morality on sexual behavior.

Course Objectives
