

Spotlight on CYLC - De Anza College

The California Youth Leadership Corps (CYLC) is a statewide partnership created to prepare the next generation of young people from marginalized communities to become community organizers and change agents in their local communities while earning a college credential at a community college. Participants earn a living wage participating in community-building internships at local social justice nonprofits, while pursuing a certificate through a learn-and earn community change career pathway program. While enrolled, students receive robust academic, and social-emotional supports; career advising; and leadership development and mentoring to help them succeed. De Anza College is one of five California pilot sites launching learn-and-earn community change career pathway programs.

For the past 13 years, De Anza College's Certificate in Leadership and Social Change has prepared students to pursue a career working in the nonprofit sector and/or to transfer to a four-year degree. Graduates have gone on to be significant community leaders in the Silicon Valley. Through the new collaboration with CYLC, De Anza is able to recruit students who were not already in college and provide them with a transformational experience. CYLC students leave the program seeing themselves as people able to create change.

CYLC students

- ✓ Can earn up to \$10,000 for their community work contributions
- ✓ Are eligible to earn up to \$5,000 in bonuses
- ✓ Engage in power-building and leadership development
- ✓ Receive holistic academic, social-emotional, and career advising supports to succeed
- ✓ Core classes evenings, online, synchronous
