ICS 2 CROSS-CULTURAL PERSPECTIVES FOR A MULTICULTURAL SOCIETY 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)

Four hours lecture.

A study of diversity and relativity in culture with emphasis on American, European and Third World ethnic groups. An examination of values and practices of cultural pluralism. Offered F.

ICS 4 CULTURAL IDENTITY AND SOCIAL STIGMA 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)

Four hours lecture.

A study of cultural identity within pluralistic, culturally diverse societies. Considers problems of stigmatized identity and conflicting evaluative systems. Explores ethnic group identity issues.

ICS 6 SURVEY OF THIRD WORLD EXPERIENCE IN THE UNITED STATES 5 Units

Five hours lecture.

A survey of Third World people's experience in the United States including a critical examination of theories of political and social change. Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program. Interested persons should contact the department involved.

A survey of Third World women in relationship to family, ethnic community and society. Emphasis on the socio-psychological effects of role expectations and conflicting cultural values. Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program. Interested persons should contact the department involved.

Parallel: ICS 9 parallels Ethnic Studies 114, Calif. Polytechnic State U., San Luis Obispo.

One hour lecture for each unit of credit.

A survey of the varied racial and cultural aspects of race relations in American society. Examines the concepts of minority and dominant groups, focusing on the nature of prejudice discrimination and racism and their effect upon human behavior. Offered FWS (ICS 9). Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program. Interested persons should contact the department involved (ICS 9G,H,J).

ICS 10 INTRODUCTION TO AFRO-AMERICAN STUDIES 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisite: None. (Will satisfy Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)

Four hours lecture.

An interdisciplinary introduction to and survey of the Afro American. Emphasis on the socio-economic and political status of the Afro American in the twentieth century.

ICS 11 ROOTS OF AFRO-AMERICAN CULTURE 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)

Four hours lecture.

An interdisciplinary course which correlates areas of the social sciences, natural sciences, and humanities as they relate to the history and the cultural heritage of Afro-Americans.

ICS 12 INTRODUCTION TO AFRO-AMERICAN LITERATURE 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)

Four hours lecture.

An introductory course in the study of Afro-American literature, includes the methods of evaluation and analysis essential for understanding and appreciating the literary contributions of the Afro-American writer in America, focuses on the contemporary writers.

ICS 13 A SOCIOLOGICAL PROFILE OF AFRO-AMERICAN LIFE 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)

Four hours lecture.

Fundamental concepts and theories of social psychology with comparative emphasis on the Black man and his culture in white America. **Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program. Interested persons should contact the department involved.**

ICS 14 CINEMA AND THE AFRO-AMERICAN 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Also listed as Film 48. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.)
Four hours lecture.

Illustrates the evolution of Afro-Americans in American films. Focuses on past and present feature films with particular emphasis given to those productions which have given rise to racial stereotypes and to those which have presented a more realistic portrayal of Afro-American life and culture.

ICS 16A HISTORY OF AFRICA TO 1800 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Also listed as History 16A. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.) (Will satisfy Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

A study of pre-history Africa (the ancestral home of the American Blacks); ancient African civilizations to the decline of the Portuguese hegemony in the coastal city states of the Indian Ocean; an examination of the cultural, political, and economic developments of the peoples of the African continent; race and racism; colonialism; prejudice; contact theories, and history of country(ies) of the origin of Third World peoples in the United States.

ICS 16B HISTORY OF AFRICA FROM 1800 TO PRESENT 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisite: None. (Also listed as History 16B. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.) (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

A study of African history in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries; race and racism; colonialism; prejudice; contact theories; and history of country(ies) of the origin of Third World peoples in the United States; an examination of the implications of European expansion into Africa. "The Scramble for Africa," and the growth of African nationalism.

ICS 18A AFRO-AMERICAN HISTORY TO 1865 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Also listed as History 18A. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.) (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

History of the Afro-American in the United States from the Atlantic slave trade to 1865; role of the Afro-American in the political, social, and economic life of the United States; the institution of slavery; the free Black in the North; the abolitionist movement. **Offered FS.**

ICS 18B AFRO-AMERICAN HISTORY SINCE 1865 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Also listed as History 18B. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.) (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

History of the Afro-American in the United States since 1865. Role of the Afro-American in the political, social and economic life of the United States. Afro-American protest movement. Black Power as a phenomenon. (History 17A and Afro-American Studies 25B satisfy the American History and Institutions requirement.) **Offered W.**

ICS 19A HISTORY OF ASIAN CIVILIZATION 4 Units

Prerequisite: None. (Also listed as History 19A. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.)
Four hours lecture.

An introductory study of the history and culture of traditional China and Japan prior to the nineteenth century.

ICS 19B HISTORY OF ASIAN CIVILIZATION 4 Units

Prerequisite: None. (Also listed as History 19B. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.)
Four hours lecture.

An introductory study of the development of modern China and Japan in response to the impact of the West, and their role in world affairs.

ICS 19C HISTORY OF ASIAN CIVILIZATION 4 Units

Prerequisite: None. (Also listed as History 19C. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.)
Four hours lecture.

An introductory study of the history and culture of India and southeast Asia, from their origins to the present.

ICS 20 INTRODUCTION TO ASIAN-AMERICAN STUDIES 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

Systematic examination of the status of Asians in America.

ICS 21 HISTORY OF THE CHINESE IN THE UNITED STATES 4 Units

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

The study of the Chinese in the United States; their background; why they immigrated; their role in the development of the West and the political and social forces which shaped the Chinese culture and society within the American context.

ICS 22 CONTEMPORARY ASIAN AMERICAN 4 Units

Prerequisite: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

An analytical and in-depth study from a historical perspective of the contemporary problems and issues facing the Asian-Americans in the United States, with special emphasis on the process of assimilation and integration in terms of social change and progress within the American society of cultural pluralism.

ICS 23 THE JAPANESE IN THE UNITED STATES 4 Units

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

A critical analysis of the Japanese in the United States with a special emphasis on the Issei and Nisei as the fountainhead for the Japanese experience.

ICS 30 INTRODUCTION TO CHICANO STUDIES 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

An interdisciplinary introduction to and survey of the Chicano. Emphasis on the socio-economic and political status of the twentieth century Chicano.

ICS 31 CHICANO CULTURE 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

Survey of the origins and development of Chicano culture with emphasis on the religions, philosophies, and life styles of the Chicano.

ICS 32 CHICANO HISTORY 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

Historical examination of the contemporary Chicano from 1848 to the present. Emphasis on the neo-colonization of the Chicano, politics, migration, unions and strike activities, community organizations, education, and socio-economic development.

ICS 33 THE CHICANO AND THE ARTS 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

Survey and analysis of contemporary Chicano art, drama, music, and literature, and their influence on the emerging Chicano.

ICS 35 CHICANO LITERATURE 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.
Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)
Four hours lecture.

A survey of Chicano literature through an analysis and criticism of selected essays, poetry, short stories, novels, biographies, and autobiographies.

ICS 36A SPANISH FOR BILINGUAL STUDENTS 5 Units

Prerequisite: Basic speaking knowledge of Spanish. (Also listed as Spanish 36A. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.)
Five hours lecture, two hour laboratory.

Basic course in Spanish especially designed to meet the needs of bilingual students already familiar with Spanish through home environment but with limited oral and written communication skills. Using the students' own knowledge of the

language as a point of departure, the course will stress grammar and vocabulary building in development skills for language proficiency. **Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program.** Interested persons should contact the department involved.

ICS 36B SPANISH FOR BILINGUAL STUDENTS 5 Units

Prerequisite: Chicano 36A/Spanish 36A or equivalent. (Also listed as Spanish 36B. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.)

Five hours lecture, two hours laboratory.

Elementary course in Spanish, designed to meet the needs of bilingual students with basic fluency who want to improve their oral and written communication skills through extensive vocabulary building, grammar study, and practice in reading and writing. **Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program.** Interested persons should contact the department involved.

ICS 36C SPANISH FOR BILINGUAL STUDENTS 5 Units

Prerequisite: Chicano 36B/Spanish 36B or equivalent. (Also listed as Spanish 36C. Student may enroll in either department, but not both, for credit.)

Five hours lecture, two hours laboratory.

Intermediate course in Spanish, designed to meet the needs of bilingual students who want to improve their oral and written communication skills through vocabulary study, contrastive analysis of "Chicano dialect" and "standard Spanish" usage, and intensive reading and writing practice. **Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program.** Interested persons should contact the department involved.

ICS 38 LATIN AMERICA: REFORM & REVOLUTION 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)

Four hours lecture.

Introduction to Latin America with emphasis on the social, political, and economic institutions which have shaped the present, and the twentieth century struggle for change within these institutions. **Offered W.**

ICS 39 LATIN AMERICAN SOCIAL HISTORY 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy the Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirement.)

Four hours lecture.

Historical and contemporary perspective of the role of the disenfranchised people in Latin American society; emphasis on institutions which perpetuate dependency and poverty, including the effects on life styles and cultural patterns. **Offered S.**

ICS 41 NATIVE AMERICAN SOCIOLOGY 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirements.)

Four hours lecture.

A study of cultural and intercultural problems confronting the Native Americans today. Attention will be focused upon the tribal economic and social systems and the clash of values between the majority culture and the Native Americans, rural and urban.

ICS 42 HISTORY OF NATIVE AMERICANS OF CALIFORNIA 4 Units

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirements.)

Four hours lecture.

A study of the history and culture of the Native Americans of California with special emphasis on the inhabitants of the Central California region. **Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program.** Interested persons should contact the department involved.

ICS 43 HISTORY OF THE NATIVE AMERICAN 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirements.)

Four hours lecture.

A survey course covering the Native American from Pre-Columbian times to the twentieth century. Particular attention will be given to the Colonial and Expansionist period in American history and their effect on the original Native American inhabitants.

ICS 44 NATIVE AMERICAN PHILOSOPHY BELIEF SYSTEMS 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirements.)

Four hours lecture.

Comparative study of Native American belief systems, world view and religions.

Emphasis will be placed on the role and effect Native American belief systems have upon the life styles and behavior of the Native American.

ICS 45 SURVEY OF NATIVE AMERICAN ARTS 3 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None.

Three hours lecture.

Survey of Native American Arts as seen through architecture, carving, ceramics, weaving, jewelry design, painting and sculpture, emphasis is divided between prehistoric, historic and modern artistic traditions. **Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program.** Interested persons should contact the department involved.

ICS 46 NATIVE AMERICAN CONTEMPORARY LITERATURE 4 Units

• Satisfies GE requirement.

Prerequisites: None. (Will satisfy Intercultural Studies Associate Degree requirements.)

Four hours lecture.

An introduction to Native American literature through an analysis of novels, biographies, poetry and essays. **Offered only on demand — refers to courses offered as part of a much larger program.** Interested persons should contact the department involved.

JOURN 21A NEWSPAPER WRITING AND REPORTING 3 Units

Prerequisites: Journalism 2; ability to typewrite; English 1A.

Parallels: Journalism 21A, 21B, and 21C parallel Journalism 60A and 60B, San Jose State University; Journalism 203, Calif. Polytechnic State U., San Luis Obispo.

Two hours lecture, three hours laboratory.

Instruction and practice in reporting and the fundamentals of news writing with analysis of typical news stories. Concentration on the language and style of news writing, organization and structure of news stories; the lead and basic story types. Special projects and individual writing conferences. Practical writing experience. **Offered F. Day only.**

Detailed methods for gathering and writing news. Instruction and practice in handling standard reportorial assignments. Continued practice in writing more complex and special story types.
