Subject: Title IX Student Survey, Fall 2024

The Title IX online survey was sent by the Office of Communications to students enrolled during fall 2024 quarter. The survey was sent to 17,411 student enrollees. A total of 499 responses were collected between May 18, 2021 and May 28, 2021 for a response rate of 3%.

Survey Highlights

Demographics

- Most of the survey respondents are in their first quarter at De Anza (43%), followed by 8 or more quarters (19%) and 4 to 5 quarters (13%).
- Respondents are likely to be between 18 to 24 years old (58%), Asian (41%) or White (23%), equally distributed between female and male (45%) and heterosexual (71%).

General Climate

- 89% (390) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" they feel safe at De Anza.
- 48% (211) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" they know where to report sexual harassment, misconduct or assault issues on campus.
- 46% (203) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" they know how to report sexual harassment, misconduct or assault issues on campus.
- 51% (224) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" they know where to find sexual harassment / Title IX information on the De Anza website.
- 70% (308) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" they would feel comfortable reporting sexual harassment, misconduct or assault issues to a De Anza employee.

eCheckup To Go Sexual Violence Prevention Program

- 18% (79) of respondents indicated they have completed the eCheckup To Go Sexual Violence Prevention Program, which is available as a student app in MyPortal.
- Of the respondents who accessed eCheckup, 85% (68) of respondents indicated they found the eCheckup To Go Sexual Violence Prevention Program training "very useful".

Leadership, Policies and Reporting Perceptions

- 63% (228) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" college officials would handle sexual harassment, misconduct or assault reports in a fair and responsible manner.
- 68% (246) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" the college will implement the formal procedures to address Title IX reports of any sexual harassment, misconduct or assault fairly.
- 65% (234) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" the college would implement formal procedures before they take corrective action against the offender.
- 62% (225) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" the college would implement the same formal procedures before they take corrective action if the offender was a De Anza College employee.
- 66% (238) of respondents "agreed" or "strongly agreed" the college would take steps to protect the person making the report from retaliation.

Behavior and Consent

- Respondents were asked to rate on a scale from 1 to 5, with 1 being strongly disagree and 5 being strongly agree, their level of agreement with the statements listed below. Results are summarized for responses rated as a 1 or 2.
 - 81% (267) of respondents disagreed that if someone goes to a room alone with another person at a party, it is their own fault if they are sexually assaulted.
 - 49% (163) of respondents disagreed that if someone hooks up with a lot of people, eventually they are going to get into trouble.
 - 61% (200) of respondents disagreed that people don't usually intend to sexually assault another person, but sometimes they get too sexually carried away.
 - 74% (243) of respondents disagreed that if someone is sexually assaulted while they are drunk, they are at least somewhat responsible for what happened.
 - 54% (176) of respondents disagreed that if someone is drunk, they might sexually assault someone unintentionally.
 - 85% (277) of respondents disagreed that if someone doesn't physically fight back, you can't really say they were sexually assaulted.
 - 78% (252) of respondents disagreed that if someone doesn't say "no," they can't claim sexual assault.
 - 57% (183) of respondents disagreed that many times, people who say they were sexually assaulted agreed to have sex and then regret it.

Sexual Assault Perceptions


• Respondents were asked to rate on a scale from 1 to 5, with 1 being not likely and 5 being extremely likely, with their likely engagement in the following activities listed below. Results are summarized for responses rated as a 4 or 5.

- 73% (203) of respondents were likely to: I ask for verbal consent when I am intimate with my partner, even if we are in a long-term relationship.
- 87% (244) of respondents were likely to: I stop having sex with a partner if they say to stop, even if it started consensually.
- 76% (212) of respondents were likely to: I decide not to have sex with a partner if they are drunk.
- 86% (236) of respondents were likely to: I stop sexual activity when asked to, even if I am already sexually aroused.
- 83% (235) of respondents were likely to: I'll confront a friend who plans to give someone alcohol to initiative sex.
- 87% (248) of respondents were likely to: I'll confront a friend who is hooking up with someone who is passed out.
- 67% (191) of respondents were likely to: I'll challenge a friend who uses insulting words to describe someone.
- 61% (174) of respondents were likely to agree: I'll challenge a friend who made a sexist joke.

Sexual Misconduct

- 4% (13) of respondents have experienced unwanted behavior on campus, in an online class, or through a college sponsored activity.
- Respondents were probed about the unwanted behavior and whether they confided in anyone. Answer choices were provided and respondents could select more than one response. Respondents indicated the type of unwanted behavior was sexual harassment (7), stalking (5) and/or unwanted contact while/after drinking alcohol (4).
- Of the respondents who experienced unwanted behavior, 43% (6) indicated they did not know who was involved in the unwanted behavior, while 21% (3) indicated it was a friend.
- Of the respondents who experienced unwanted behavior, 83% (10) indicated they told someone. Respondents indicated they told a close friend other than a roommate (6) and/or a college employee (4). 17% (2) indicated they did not tell anyone, the reasons for not telling anyone included wanted to forget it happened (1), didn't think other would think it was serious (1), and thought I would be blamed for what happened (1), among other options.
- 44% (4) of respondents made a formal report of the incident using De Anza College's formal reporting process.
- 75% (3) of respondents indicated the college's formal process helped them deal with the incident.


Q1 How many quarters have you been a student at De Anza College?

Q2 What is your age?



Q3 Which ethnic group do you most identify with? (select all that apply)



Q4 Which gender do you most identify with?








Q5 Which term best describes your sexual orientation?







Q6 Please provide your level of agreement with the following statements:







Q8 How useful did you think the eCheckup To Go Sexual Violence Prevention Program training was?




Q11 How likely are you to engage in the following activities? Please answer on a scale from 1 (not likely) to 5 (extremely likely).








Q12 Have you experienced unwanted behavior on campus or through a college sponsored activity?

Q13 What kind of unwanted behavior have you experienced? (select all that apply).



Q14 Who did the unwanted behavior involve?



Q15 Did you tell anyone about the incident?



Q16 Who did you tell about the incident? (select all that apply)




Q17 Did you make a formal report of the incident(s) using De Anza College's formal reporting process?

Q18 Did the college's formal process help you deal with the incident?







