COURSE DISCRIPTION

A history of women in relation to society and the visual arts from prehistory to the present. Social perceptions and obstacles relevant to women artists will be discussed, and students will engage in cross-cultural comparison of works produced in western and non-western cultures made by women, and in which women serve as subject matter.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOME STATEMENTS (SLO)

- Students will analyze the social experiences of artists, demonstrating how artists' relationships with their patrons was a defining factor in the production of works of art.
- Students will demonstrate visual literacy and critical thinking skills by evaluating diverse scholarly perspectives when interpreting of works of art.
- Students will investigate different techniques utilized in the production of works of art through written analysis based on firsthand evaluation of art objects in local collections.



