Course Description:

Further development of material presented in KORE 2. Intensive oral practice broadens the functions presented in KORE 2 and adding new ones. Written practice to further understanding of the underlying grammatical and syntactical structures.

Prerequisites: Korean 2 or equivalent Korean language skills.

Student Learning Outcomes

- Student Learning Outcome 1: Demonstrate a somewhat consistent working command of essential vocabulary (recognize and reproduce at least 350 Korean words and expressions) and language structures necessary to request and provide, orally and in writing, a more complex/abstract range of information relating to high-frequency situations in familiar contexts such as making an apology and giving reasons, asking for an opinion, extending/accepting/declining invitations, expressing reservations, asking about prices, and ordering food/describing tastes.
- Student Learning Outcome 2: Derive meaning from longer, simple texts on familiar topics, relying on contextual clues to extract main ideas and supporting details.
- Student Learning Outcome 3: Compose comprehensible, more complex sentences about familiar topics to reflect a somewhat consistent command of core vocabulary and language structures.
- Student Learning Outcome 4: Demonstrate an increasingly accurate grasp of social protocols and contributions of Korean-speaking cultures, by analyzing and comparing them to one's own culture(s).

Expectations and Goals

- To complete this course, you must be able to do the following by the end of the quarter:
- Comprehend simple oral and written messages about everyday life activities.
- Produce simple and accurate sentences, orally and in writing about daily activities.
- Speak with natural and near-native speed with reasonably accurate pronunciation and speech patterns.
- Recognize and use terms of amenities in a simple conversation about everyday life activities within the range of learned vocabulary, idioms, and sentence patterns.
- Use formal and informal levels of speech.
- Compare aspects of Korean culture with those of the U.S. and recognize the differences.

Grading Policy

- **In-class Work/Participation (10%):** As the Korean 3 class is a language learning course, you will be expected to fully participate in all activities during class. Each day, many opportunities will be provided for you to practice listening, speaking, writing, and reading skills. You will be graded on appropriate and consistent engaged interaction in Korean with your classmates and your instructor.
- **Homework (20%):** There are three types of homework in this class.
 - 1) Homework is assigned at the end of each class meeting. Mostly you will be asked to complete your workbook exercise along with preparing oral/written quizzes or presentations.

- 2) Listening practice: As part of the coursework, you will spend at least one hour per week listening to the online scripts and completing exercises in the workbook. However, that 1-hour lab work can also be completed by doing listening practice with other helpful website materials or watching Korean TV or movies only if you finish your workbook exercises before one hour passes.
 - 3) Essay: This homework is intended to help students better understand Korean history and culture. It is indicated in advance on the course schedule, so please check it.
- **Test/Quiz (20%):** For each unit, you take quizzes and tests written and oral. The content of tests and quizzes will be based on completed homework and each lesson. If you complete the homework, pay attention, and participate fully in class, you will do very well on these tests and quizzes. All the tests and quizzes will be announced in advance.
 - **Presentation (10%):** Script and Oral Presentation. The oral proficiency assessment will consist of a conversation with a partner about a topic we have studied. The entire exam will take approximately 5-10 minutes and will be scheduled later in class and we will engage in many practice activities before the assessment.
 - **Midterm(20%), Final Exam (20%):** The midterm and final exam will be taken in class. The format will be similar to the exams, with listening and reading comprehension, written work, cultural material, grammatical functions, and vocabulary. No make-up will be given for the final exam and no final exams are administered early.
